Please help by spreading the word to these college students. The Scottish Rite has always had a strong Scholarship Program in the State of Washington since 1958. Last year alone, we provided a little less than a half million dollars. In fact we have done this the last three years. College is costly and the Scottish Rite Scholarship Program is here to help and change lives. The Undergraduate Student Scholarship is \$3000.

How the program works, Students go on line and enter Scottish Rite Scholarship Foundation of Washington org, in the Search bar. They fill out the request, which generates an E-Mail to the Director. The director follows up with an in person student interview. Upon successful completion of the interview, the director updates the system, which enables the student to complete the application process.

Requirements are as follows:

- * U.S. Citizen
- * Washington State Resident

- * Entering 3rd year (Junior), 4th year (Senior) or if required for degree, 5th year undergraduate*
- * Attending a <u>NWCCU</u> Baccalaureate accredited 4-year college or university in the State of Washington as a full time student for the full academic year**
- * Maintaining an accumulative GPA of at least 3.0

The Ceremony of Renewal and Remembrance

"A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another" (John 13:34). These are the words spoken by the Master of Nazareth as He broke bread with His Disciples at the Last Supper. They are simple words. Yet they express the most sublime truth: all men are brothers. We share one origin and one common obligation. The Great Teacher in this one Mandatum Novum, New Commandment, summarized the highest wisdom of all ages. He knew His time was

near, that in a few hours He would be betrayed, humiliated, and crucified. Despite this knowledge, He loved and taught love as the one absolute rule that can measure life.

In commemoration of this truth and of its central relevance to the Scottish Rite, Rose Croix Chapters traditionally observed Maundy Thursday (its name a corruption of the Latin word man datum, commandment) on the middle day of Holy Week. Freemasonry



has remembered this special day, and Brethren have gathered throughout the world to reaffirm their faith in the universal fraternity of mankind. The Code of Statutes adopted in 1866 lists Maundy Thursday as a feast day, and as of 1878, the Statutes indicated its observance as obligatory.

In deference to the Maundy Thursday rites of churches, however, in 1994 it was deemed appropriate that a Scottish Rite nonobligatory: Celebration of Remembrance and Renewal" should replace the

traditional Maundy Thursday observance and be held near the vernal equinox, March 21.

The Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal, including the Mystic Banquet, is not a religious observance. It is neither the Feast of Passover nor a Sacrament of Holy Communion, although it commemorates the spirit of both days.

The History of Freemasonry For the Month of March

March 6th—In 1775 a man named Prince Hall and 14 other men of color were initiated into Freemasonry. This work was conducted by Sergeant John Batt of the Irish Militia Lodge No 441, attached to the 38th Foot of the British army When the 38th Foot left Boston in the colony of Massachusetts three weeks later, Batt gave them a "Permet" which allowed them "to walk on St. John's Day" and "to bury their dead in manner and form." African Lodge No. 1 was born on July 3, 1775. In 1847 the African (or national) Grand lodge became Prince Hall Grand Lodge honoring the first Master of African Lodge. Since then many Prince Hall Masons have honored Prince hall as well as "Blue" Lodge Masonry and continue to do so as more and more Grand Lodge Jurisdictions world wide grant them recognition. The United Grand Lodge of England took a giant and historic step forward on December 14, 1994 when it resolved that "the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Massachusetts should now be accepted as regular and recognized." The first Grand Lodge to recognize the Prince Hall Grand Lodge within their jurisdiction was the Grand Lodge of CT. Since that time 31 other Grand Lodges in the USA have accorded various types of recognition to the local Prince Hall Grand Lodges, the latest being Virginia.

March 13—In 1863, President Lincoln hosted a formal reception in honor of circus midget General Tom Thumb (Bro. Charles S. Stratton) and his new bride Lavinia at the White House. The press played up the event, which clearly caught the public imagination. However there were editorials criticizing the president for staging such a frivolous event at a time when the Union was faring poorly in the Civil war. Showman P.T. Barnum delighted audiences with all kinds of surprising entertainment. The biggest attraction of his shows was also the smallest: a performing midget known as General Tom Thumb. Just three feet four inches tall, Tom Thumb was a well-trained actor whose witty impersonations of famous figures charmed audiences in America and Europe. At the peak of his career he even gave two private performances to Queen Victoria, who delighted in his imitations of Napoleon. In 1863 General Tom Thumb married Lavinia Warren, another midget who performed in Barnum's shows. It was the most celebrated marriage of the time, attended by two thousand guests. President and Mrs. Abraham Lincoln were invited, and although unable to attend, they did send gifts. A couple of weeks later, when the newlyweds passed through Washington on President Lincoln hosted the fete in their honor. Brother Stratton was a member of St. John's Lodge in Bridgeport, CT.

March 19—In 1891 born at Los Angeles, CA was Bro. Earl Warren , Jurist and Mason, who became Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court in 1953. Before the appointment he was Governor of California. He was Special Ambassador of the US to the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, served as Chancellor of the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the National Gallery of Art. A member of Sequoia Lodge 349 of Oakland, CA., he serve as Grand Master of California Masons 1935-36. He was a member of Oakland Chapter 36, R.A.M., and Oakland Commandery No. 11, K/T. He was at one time Potentate of Aahmes Shrine Temple of Oakland, and a member of St. Phillip Conclave No. 23, Red Cross of Constantine. He joined the Scottish Rite in Oakland in 1919 and on December 23, 1941, received the Rite's Honorary 33-deg AASR(SJ). He died at Washington, DC July 9, 1974.

March 23—In 1806, explorers Bro. Meriwether Lewis and Bro. William Clark, having reached the Pacific coast, began their journey back east. Bro. Clark, American explorer and frontier politician, joined another Freemason, Bro. Meriwether Lewis on the Lewis and Clark expedition (1804-6), the first overland exploration of the American West and Pacific Northwest. Bro. Clark was responsible for the careful mapmaking. He later served as Native American agent and governor of the Missouri Territory (1813-1821). Bro. Lewis, American soldier and explorer, also served as Governor of the Louisiana Territory and was proclaimed a National Hero. He was the first Master of St. Louis Lodge #111

March 28 -In 1921 US President and Bro. Warren G. Harding appointed Bro. William Howard Taft Chief justice of the United States (President of the Supreme Court of Justice). Bro. Taft was made a Mason "at sight on June 18, 1909 by Grand Master Charles S. Hoskinson. Bro. Taft became affiliated with Kilwinning Lodge 356 on April 4 in Cincinnati, OH. He later was made an Honorary member of Crescent Lodge 25 at Cedar Rapids, IA. A very active Mason he died March 8, 1930.



MWB Carl Bernard Smith, 33°

January 30, 1936 – February 13, 2022



Most Worshipful Brother Carl Bernard Smith was born in Seattle on January 30,1936. He attended public schools there until the family moved to Nome and later Kodiak, Alaska, when his father was transferred. Carl graduated from Kodiak High School at the top of his class. He then enrolled in the University of Washington and graduated in 1958 with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering.

He would immediately join the Boeing Company where he was employed as a Weight Engineer. He was subsequently promoted into Weights Engineering management, where he remained until his retirement on October 1, 1994. He served as the Weights Engineering Manager through the original development of the 767 and 777 airplanes now used throughout the world. His 37-year career was exemplary.

Shortly following graduation from the University, our brother met Barbara Jean Ray, and they were married in the following months. They have been blessed with two sons, Duane and Barry, who served as Master Councilors of their DeMolay Chapter; and a daughter, Brenda, who served as Worthy Advisor of her Rainbow Assembly. He and Barbara also enjoyed five grandchildren and one great grandson.

Our Past Grand Master comes from a Masonic family. His sister, Lois, is a Past Grand Royal Matron, Order of Amaranth of Washington. His father was a 30-year member of Northern Light Lodge No. 279, the Lodge into which Brother was initiated on January 9,1975. He progressed through the offices of this Lodge and Walter F. Meier Lodge of Research No. 281, and served with distinction as Worshipful Master of both of these Lodges in 1983 and 1995 respectively.

His service to Grand Lodge began in 1984 when he was appointed to the Long Range Planning Committee. He served continuously on numerous committees, then as Deputy of the Grand Master in District No. 4, Grand Lecturer, and Grand Marshal, until June 1995 when he was elected Junior Grand Warden. He would progress through the elected line in the usual fashion, being elected Grand Master at the 1998 Annual Communication.

Most Worshipful Brother Carl chose "Let Our Light Shine" as his theme. Specifically, to let the light of Masonry shine so as to increase the visibility of our Craft. To quote from his message: "There appears to be a realization that growth comes from the inside and not the outside and that when we expand who we are, we'll no longer have to accept what we've got. When we 'Let Our Light Shine' our world will expand and society will see that Masonry's purpose is to which to live."

The Brethren and Grand Lodge Team members will remember Most Worshipful Brother Carl as a Grand Master who was always well organized. PLAN was his "four letter word". It was most important to him to assure that his year as our senior management leader be fully and carefully planned so as to enable the accomplishment of the numerous objectives he had established for himself and this Grand Lodge.

During his term as Grand Master, it was his special honor to preside when both sons and his son-in-law. Jack Berryman, become Master Masons during the One Day Conferral Program.

His leadership qualities, well-honed during his professional career, enabled the Grand Lodge to progress significantly. His strong interest in the Masonic Retirement Center and his devotion and dedication to the residents drove him to work especially hard on their behalf. The pleasant and humorous manner in which he always conducted himself when visiting Lodges, presiding over cornerstone ceremonies or District meetings, or just having a conversation with a Brother is legend. His proud and unselfish dedication to our Fraternity, the Brethren, and to his family clearly demonstrated his character. He was a Mason and Grand Master whose leadership is recognized and whose friendship is cherished.

Our Past Grand Master belonged to Seattle Valley of Scottish Rite and Nile Shrine Temple, where he fulfilled several leadership roles. Coroneted a 33rd Degree Inspector General Honorary in 2003, he served as the Personal Representative of the SGIG in the Everett Valley. He is a Past Patron of Richmond Court No. 72, Order of Amaranth, and was appointed Grand Prelate, Grand Court Order of Amaranth of Washington. He is a member of Thistle Clan - Royal Order of Scotland, an Honorary Member of the DeMolay Legion of Honor,

a charter member of Pacific Northwest Chapter No. 534 National Sojourners, and a member of the Heroes of '76.

Carl's theme of "Let Our Light Shine" was no doubt influenced by his community service activities. For 22 years he volunteered as a Little League baseball umpire. During these years he was Umpire-in -Chief in two league districts, officiated in the 1975 Western Regional Tournament in San Bernadino, California; and was selected to umpire in the 1985 Little League World's Series in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. He was Chairman of a Cub Scout Advisory Board and received recognition for his scouting activities. He volunteered as a DeMolay Dad Advisor for five years and was Chairman of the Adult Advisory Board for his daughter's Rainbow Assembly.
