From the Desk of the General Secretary

Brethren, it has come to that time of the year when we must report to you on the timely remittance of annual dues. As of this writing here is where we are today. (February 2023)

We currently have 175 members. 71 (40.6%) are LIFE members. 15 (8.6%) are dues exempt (mostly 50-year members or over the age of 80 (usually incapacitated). 68 (38.9%) have paid their 2023 dues. We have 16 (9.1%) members who are due for their annual 2023 dues (these were due December 31st, 2022).

That leaves us with 5 (2.9%) members still due for 2022 and 2023. Sadly – all of these brothers have received a minimum 8-9 courtesy reminders to address the arrearage. It is unfortunate – this small group will be subject to suspension for non-payment of dues.

The Orient of Washington indicates we have approximately 2,439 members, and the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States reflects 119,311 members.

Additionally – I must report to you that since our last Ceremony of Remembrance in March 2022 where we reported the passing of 20 brothers. This month on March 20th, we will recognize 5 additional members passing to the celestial lodge above.

We are currently in the process of conferring the 4° - 14° - 18° - 30° and 32° degrees. At our last communication of the 14° held on February 6^{th} – 20 brothers showed up in support. Scheduled: 18° 3-6-23; 30° 4-3-23 and 32° 5-1-23. Cap and Ring will be held 6-5-23 prior to the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge communication on June 9^{th} and 10^{th} .

Your elected and appointed officers would sure like and appreciate your attendance and support at the meetings and degrees.



Remembrance and Renewal

The Supreme Council's new "Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal," which is recommended for use in place of the traditional Feast of Tishri observance, is not a reli-

gious ceremony. It is a Masonic ceremony to be celebrated in the spring at a time that does not conflict with the celebration of Easter. In this ceremony, we remember those who have journeyed on to the Celestial Lodge, and we renew our commitment to our own life's journey.

During this ceremony, we hear the names of our departed Brethren. These individuals are our Brothers with whom we have shared the beauty and grandeur of Masonry. The reading of these names are reminiscent of an ancient Sanskrit injunction: "Lead

us from the unreal to the real, from darkness to light, from death to immortality." As Masons, we are traveling together on a mystic journey, a journey toward greater and greater light. "The Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal" is a celebration of our Masonic bonds, an opportunity to remember our Brothers who have journeyed on before us, and a time to reflect upon our own individual quest.

In the course of our life journey, we experience cycles of darkness as well as peak experiences of joy and spiritual growth. Symbolically at this time, we move our thoughts from the darkness of winter to the renewal of spring and the promise of more light. The very name Lent is taken from the Latin word which means "to lengthen," and it is during the period of Lent that the rays of light begin to lengthen until the advent of the Vernal Equinox where day and night are equal.

The Vernal Equinox has been recognized by cultures and religions in all times as very spiritual. For example, the Christians celebrate this season with Lent, Maundy Thursday and Easter, the Iranians with the celebration of Jamshedji Nauroz, and the Jews with the observance Passover.

We might say that the Vernal Equinox is:

- A time of renewal
- A time of more light in our life
- A time of the crossing over from the darkness of winter into the light and renewal of spring
- A time for extending our vision of universal brotherhood
- A time to erase the divisions of race, creed, and religious intolerance
- A time to remember those who have journeyed on to

the Celestial Lodge

A time to thank the Creator for the men and women in our military who are sacrificing their very lives that we

> may enjoy the blessing of liberty and justice in our democratic society

A time for reflection upon the spiritual truths exemplified in the lives and ideals of the avatars, saviors, sages, and messengers of light of all ages.

"Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal," we draw from that well.

Freemasonry provides us with insights into the assimilation of light. Our Craft has been likened to a deep well out of which each Mason draws according to his own understanding and enlightenment. During the

of its universal symbols and rituals. A symbol contains the essence of a truth. A universal symbol contains a universal truth. The universal symbols displayed during the "Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal" include, among others, the Cross, the Star of David, and the Volumes of the Sacred Law. These universal symbols can be viewed on many levels.

For example, the Christian might associate the cross with the crucifixion; the Buddhist with the sacred Boddhi tree under which the Buddha received enlightenment; the psychologist as an archetypical symbol found within the collective unconscious; and the philosopher as a universal metaphor of human perfection to be found within man himself.

The Star of David is also a universal symbol. Culturally, it is synonymous with Judaism. In addition, however, the Star of David is sometimes referred to as the Seal of Solomon. The United States dollar bill has a Star of David etched on one side with 13 points or stars in the form of two intersecting triangles. Symbolically, the triangle is the symbol of Deity found in teachings of Freemasonry as well as in many of the world's religions. For example, in Christianity the Trinity is represented as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In Hinduism, it is represented as Brahma, Vishnu, and Shiva. And in Freemasonry, it is represented by the three greater and lesser lights.

A deeper interpretation of the Star of David is that the bottom triangle symbolizes God within man while the upper triangle represents the Transcendent Deity. Taken together, the two interlaced triangles reveal the union of man with Deity.

Multiple Volumes of the Sacred Law rest on the Masonic altar. They may include the Holy Bible, the Koran, the Upanishads, the Zend-Avesta, or whatever book or books Masons deem to be their sacred scripture. Scripture is the means by which we regulate our life and discover truth. In Freemasonry, we are taught that scripture is given to us by God for the "rule and guide of our faith."

Freemasons use these universal symbols in the context of their own culture, their own religious preference, and their own self-development. In addition to being universal symbols, the icons noted above are images we individually associ-

provide us with insights into ourselves and light for our journey through life.

Accordingly, we, each of us, worships the Creator in our own way, according to the dictates of our own con-



science, in our own church, or our own synagogue, or our own mosque, or in our own temple. The ritual exemplified in the "Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal" allows each person, regardless of religious background and belief, to share, in a broader, more universal context, the spiritual significance of this festive season.

As Masons, we strive to exemplify Masonic light. The "Ceremony of Remembrance and Renewal" provides a moving experience and a symbolic foundation on which to build an expanded, more universal celebration of the grandeur, the beauty, the harmony, and the mystery of life and our Craft. To cite the final words of the ceremony: "I give to you all the hope of spring re-

ate with our respective cultures and personal beliefs. They newed with its attendant bounty. May Brotherly Love prevail and may we ever be united in every social and moral virtue, cemented in the mystic and universal bond of Masonic Brotherhood."

From the Farmer's Almanac, 1823

The following definition of Masonic character appeared in an 1823 edition of the Farmers Almanac that was published in Andover, Massachusetts.

'The real Freemason is distinguished from the rest of Mankind by the uniform unrestrained rectitude of his conduct. Other men are honest in fear of punishment which the law might inflect; they are religious in expectation of being rewarded, or in dread of the devil, in the next world. A Freemason would be just if there were no laws, human or divine except those written in his heart by the finger of his Creator. In every climate, under every system of religion, he is the same. He kneels before the Universal Throne of God in gratitude for the blessings he has received

and humble solicitation for his future protection. He venerates the good men of all religions. He disturbs not the religion of others. He restrains his passions, because they cannot be indulged without injuring his neighbor or himself. He gives no offense, because he does not choose to be offended. He contracts no debts which he is certain he cannot discharge, because he is honest upon principle."

The History of Freemasons For the Month of March

March 6th—In 1775 a man named Prince Hall and 14 other men of color were initiated into Freemasonry. This work was conducted by Sergeant John Batt of the Irish Militia Lodge No 441, attached to the 38th Foot of the British army When the 38th Foot left Boston in the colony of Massachusetts three weeks later, Batt gave them a "Permet" which allowed them "to walk on St. John's Day" and "to bury their dead in manner and form." African Lodge No. 1 was born on July 3, 1775. In 1847 the African (or national) Grand lodge became Prince Hall Grand Lodge honoring the first Master of African Lodge. Since then many Prince Hall Masons have honored Prince hall as well as "Blue" Lodge Masonry and continue to do so as more and more Grand Lodge Jurisdictions world wide grant them recognition. The United Grand Lodge of England took a giant and historic step forward on December 14, 1994 when it resolved that "the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Massachusetts should now be accepted as regular and recognized." The first Grand Lodge to recognize the Prince Hall Grand Lodge within their jurisdiction was the Grand Lodge of CT. Since that time 31 other Grand Lodges in the USA have accorded various types of recognition to the local Prince Hall Grand Lodges, the latest being Virginia

March 13—In 1863, President Lincoln hosted a formal reception in honor of circus midget General Tom Thumb (Bro. Charles S. Stratton) and his new bride Lavinia at the White House. The press played up the event, which clearly caught the public imagination. However there were editorials criticizing the president for staging such a frivolous event at a time when the Union was faring poorly in the Civil war. Showman P.T. Barnum delighted audiences with all kinds of surprising entertainment. The biggest attraction of his shows was also the smallest: a performing midget known as General Tom Thumb. Just three feet four inches tall, Tom Thumb was a well-trained actor whose witty impersonations of famous figures charmed audiences in America and Europe. At the peak of his career he even gave two private performances to Queen Victoria, who delighted in his imitations of Napoleon. In 1863 General Tom Thumb married Lavinia Warren, another midget who performed in Barnum's shows. It was the most celebrated marriage of the time, attended by two thousand guests. President and Mrs. Abraham Lincoln were invited, and although unable to attend, they did send gifts. A couple of weeks later, when the newlyweds passed through Washington on President Lincoln hosted the fete in their honor. Brother Stratton was a member of St. John's Lodge in Bridgeport, CT.

March 19—In 1891 born at Los Angeles, CA was Bro. Earl Warren, Jurist and Mason, who became Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court in 1953. Before the appointment he was Governor of California. He was Special Ambassador of the US to the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, served as Chancellor of the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the National Gallery of Art. A member of Sequoia Lodge 349 of Oakland, CA., he serve as Grand Master of California Masons 1935-36. He was a member of Oakland Chapter 36, R.A.M., and Oakland Commandery No. 11, K/T. He was at one time Potentate of Aahmes Shrine Temple of Oakland, and a member of St. Phillip Conclave No. 23, Red Cross of Constantine. He joined the Scottish Rite in Oakland in 1919 and on December 23, 1941, received the Rite's Honorary 33-deg AASR(SJ). He died at Washington, DC July 9, 1974.

March 23—In 1806, explorers Bro. Meriwether Lewis and Bro. William Clark, having reached the Pacific coast, began their journey back east. Bro. Clark, American explorer and frontier politician, joined another Freemason, Bro. Meriwether Lewis on the Lewis and Clark expedition (1804-6), the first overland exploration of the American West and Pacific Northwest. Bro. Clark was responsible for the careful mapmaking. He later served as Native American agent and governor of the Missouri Territory (1813-1821). Bro. Lewis, American soldier and explorer, also served as Governor of the Louisiana Territory and was proclaimed a National Hero. He was the first Master of St. Louis Lodge #111

March 28 -In 1921 US President and Bro. Warren G. Harding appointed Bro. William Howard Taft Chief justice of the United States (President of the Supreme Court of Justice). Bro. Taft was made a Mason "at sight on June 18, 1909 by Grand Master Charles S. Hoskinson. Bro. Taft became affiliated with Kilwinning Lodge 356 on April 4 in Cincinnati, OH. He later was made an Honorary member of Crescent Lodge 25 at Cedar Rapids, IA. A very active Mason he died March 8, 1930.
