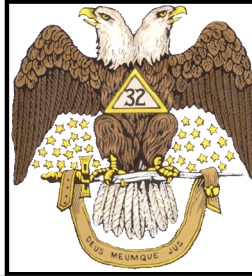

From the Treasurer

On Monday, May 3rd, 2021, the Lodge of Perfection met at the Scottish Rite Temple in which, as the Treasurer for the Valley, gave a report to the members present of the current financial status.

At this meeting, I discussed both the Annual Fixed Obligations as well as our Monthly Obligations for both the Valley and the Temple Board. The Annual Obligations for both the Valley at \$16, 298 and the Temple Board at \$19,558.36 for a total of \$35,856.36. I also discussed the Temple Boards monthly utilities expenses required for the daily operations of the building for the year 2021 to be approximately \$18,000.

The Valley of Everett Temple Board may also have some unexpected repair expenditures such as emergency elevator repairs, kitchen repairs, building maintenance with unknown expenditures.

At the present time, the Valley of Everett receives a total of \$21,360 per year rent from all our tenants which includes the Valley of Everett for a total of \$480 per month for a total of \$5,760 annually to the Temple Board.

The Temple Board is attempting to have our kitchen certified by the Snohomish County Health Department to be designated a Commercial kitchen which will allow for more rental income to the Valley by additional catering tenants.

By being a members of the Valley of Everett, the owners of this building requires all of us to be a responsible member. We all need to be sharing in the burden to maintain and keep our responsibilities for its success.

At the Lodge of Perfection meeting on May 3rd, 2021

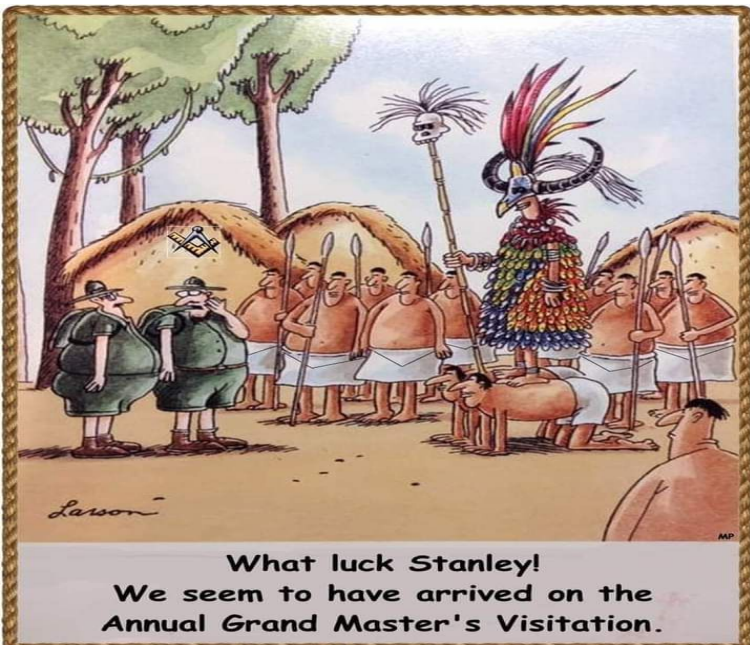
after my presentation, the following motion was made, second and approved by those members present that the Annual Dues for the Valley of Everett will be as follows:

Annual Dues - For the year of 2022, members paying annual dues will pay \$150.00. For the year 2023 and 2024 that the annual dues will remain \$150 but will be required to pay the \$37.00 per capita as assessed by Supreme Council and the Orient of Washington for a total of \$187.00.

Life Member- it was also approved by the members that all Life Members will, voluntarily, if their financial situation permits, pay their own per capita for 2022 at \$37 and when the 2023 and 2024 per capita are due, that they pay the required per capita as assessed at that time if their financial situation allows.

The Valley General Secretary will be sending out notification out to all our Life Members, approximately October of each year with a letter of request and a self addressed return envelope requesting our Valley Life Members to voluntarily pay the \$37 per capita for the year 2022 and the amount annual per capita in the ensuing years.

Brethren all, we all have the responsibility as Members of the Valley of Everett, to keep the Valley, your Valley, healthy and our Temple solvent and with your help, the Valley of Everett will be successful. Thank you.

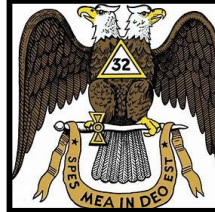

Council of Kadosh

Although Harry S. Truman was an ordinary man, his contributions were spectacular!

This is a continuation of my May article, when I wrote about our first President, George Washington's contribution to the building and beautification of Washington, D.C. President Washington had laid the cornerstone of the Capital with a Masonic trowel and had earlier taken his oath of office on a Masonic Bible. This article will highlight the reconstruction of the White House in 1949, when Harry S. Truman was president.

Brother Harry Truman was a farmer when he was elected to receive his degrees of Masonry at the Belton Lodge # 450 Belton, Missouri on January 30, 1909. By March, having become "letter perfect" in the ritual, he passed to Master Mason. In the autumn of 1909 Harry was appointed a deacon. The following year he organized a new lodge, Grandview Lodge No. 618 in Grandview, Missouri and was seated as the first Master of Grandview Lodge.

Brother Truman achieved the 32nd Degree as a Scottish Rite Mason in 1917, a member of the Palestine Commandery No. 17, Knights Templar, in Inde-



pendence, Missouri; the last step in the York Rite, in 1923. On Oct. 19th, 1945 President Truman received his 33rd Degree from the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction. President Truman was the only President to receive this distinction!

MWB Harry Truman while serving as a United States Senator, from Missouri during 1940-41, was elected as Grand Master, for the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Mason in the Missouri jurisdiction. He became

only the second American President to attain this distinction.

President Truman's contribution for the remodeling of the White House had begun in 1949, when the exterior walls were the only structure to remain standing. They were 149 years old and had sustained damage in 1814 when the British had attempted to burn down the White House. Everything below the third floor was hollowed out. The original walls were setting on a clay foundation. They were now reinforced with 126 four-foot square pits, which were dug down to a firm stratum of gravel.

I had toured the White House in 1984 and was deeply impressed by President Truman's restoration.

Supreme Council, 33°, SJ Apollo XI Flag

In July 1969, this Supreme Council, 33°, Southern Jurisdiction, flag traveled to the moon and back with NASA astronaut Ill. Edwin E. "Buzz" Aldrin, 33°, on the historic *Apollo XI* shuttle mission. Hand sewn by Supreme Council Librarian Inge Baum, the gold-bordered, white silk flag measures 11.81 in. wide by 8.66 in. long and features the 33° Dou-

ble-headed Eagle in its center. To the left of the eagle is the official emblem of the Sovereign Grand Commander—a purple right-leaning Cross of Salem with crosslets—and to the right, a square & compasses with the letter *G* in its center.



Flag Day

In the United States, **Flag Day** is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution, passed on June 14, 1777, stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

The United States Army also celebrates the U.S. Army birthday on this date; Congress adopted "the American continental army" after reaching a consensus position in the Committee of the Whole on June 14, 1775.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; on August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. Title 36 of the United States Code, Subtitle I, Part A, CHAPTER 1, § 110 is the official statute on Flag Day; however, it is at the president's discretion to officially proclaim the observance. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the

town of Rennerdale. New York Statutes designate the second Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

Perhaps the oldest continuing Flag Day parade is in Fairfield, Washington (situated in Spokane County). Beginning in 1909 or 1910, Fairfield has held a parade every year since, with the possible exception of 1918, and celebrated the "Centennial" parade in 2010, along with some other commemorative events. Appleton, Wisconsin, claims to be the oldest National Flag Day parade in the nation, held annually since 1950.

Quincy, Massachusetts, has had an annual Flag Day parade since 1952 and claims it "is the longest-running parade of its kind" in the U.S. The largest Flag Day parade had been held annually in Troy, New York until 2017, which based its parade on the Quincy parade and typically draws 50,000 spectators. In addition, the Three Oaks, Michigan, Flag Day Parade is held annually on the weekend of Flag Day and is a three-day event and they claim to have the largest Flag Day parade in the nation as well as the oldest. In Washington, D.C., Flag Day is celebrated heavily through the 7th and 8th Wards of the city. It is said that Clyde Thompson is the "Godfather of Flag Day".
