



# The History of Freemasons For the Month of June

June 2—In 1897, Bro. Mark Twain, 61, was quoted by the New York Journal as saying from London, "The report of my death was an exaggeration." The line was afterwards frequently quoted. Twain, whose real name was Samuel Langhorn Clemens, was a member of Polar Star Lodge No. 79 in St., Louis, MO. At one point he was suspended but reinstated on April 24, 1867. However, he demitted October 8, 1868 and never again affiliated with any Lodge.

June 3— In 1888 the famous comic ballad "Casey at the Bat" appeared in the San Francisco Examiner. Though attributed to "anonymous" the author was serious poet Ernest L. Thayer who was paid \$5 for the effort that led to most of his other works being forgotten. But it triggered a happy career for Bro. DeWolff Hopper who recited "Casey at the Bat" for the first time at Wallack's Theater in New York City. And no fewer than 10,000 times after that as part of his comic repertoire. The recitation, which made both the poem and himself famous, took five minutes and 40 seconds, and never failed to "bring down the house." Bro. Hopper was raised in Pacific Lodge No 233, New York city, in 1890, and was 32 deg. AASR (NJ), and a member of Mecca Shrine Temple in New York City. He died September 23, 1935.

June 7—In 1755, born at Coventry, CT was the American patriot, Bro. Nathan Hale. .During the battles for New York in the American Revolution he volunteered to seek military intelligence behind enemy lines and was captured on the night of September 21, 1776. Before British General William Howe, Bro. Hale admitted to being an American officer and was ordered hanged the following morning. His dying words reportedly were: "I only regret I have but one life to lose for my country,." He was hanged September 22, 1776, at what is now the intersection of Market Street and East Broadway,

June 11—In 1776, the Continental Congress formed a committee to draft a Declaration of Independence from Britain. Named to the committee were Virginian Thomas Jefferson; John Adams of Massachusetts; Bro. Benjamin Franklin, Pennsylvania; Bro. Robert Livingston of New York, and Bro. Roger Sherman. of Massachusetts. James Smith, a Dubliner and George Taylor from Belfast were both Delegates from Pennsylvania, and Matthew Thornton, from Dublin, represented New Hampshire. Jefferson is credited with the writing.

June 12—In1929 the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum was dedicated at Cooperstown, NY. More than 200 individuals have been honored for their contributions to the game of baseball by into the Baseball Hall of Fame. Of the first five players to be so honored, three were Freemasons: Bro. Tyrus R. "Ty" Cobb of Royston Lodge No.52, Detroit, MI; Bro. John "Honus" Wagner of Centennial Lodge No. 544, Carnegie, PA; Bro. Christopher "Christie:" Mathewson of New York City's Architect Lodge No. 519. The non Masons were Walter Johnson and Babe Ruth.

June 12 In 1923, the magician and Mason Bro. Harry Houdini amazed a large and disbelieving audience as he freed himself from a straitjacket while suspended upside-down 40 feet (12 m) above the ground in New York City. The Hungarian entertainer was famous worldwide for staging the most dazzling and difficult escapes. Bro. Houdini was raised August 21, 1923 in St. Cecile Lodge No. 568 in New York City. He later came a member of Mecca Shrine Temple. He died October 31, 1926.

### Flag Day, June 14th, 2022 THE MAKING OF THE FLAG

Oh! Gallant Banner, red and white and blue, how bold I see you in your peace and quiet grandeur there-A bit of cloth and splash Or color that conceals The valor and devotion written in each fold.

You draw my gaze and compel me to look upon you with awe and reverence! As in a dream, my thoughts touch on moments from history past and the scenes flash across my consciousness like pictures on a movie screen.

I see those dedicated and farsighted men, so well acquainted with our Brotherhood, who laid the foundation-stones of our Democracy; who in Boston Harbor brought the kettle to a boil and brewed a giant cup of tea--then, in the darkness, a winking light high above the river, then muffled oars, then horsemen riding desperately to rouse the countryside against marauding Redcoats at Lexington and Concord, men fighting as no fight was ever fought before--with our great Brother Washington as he and his beleaguered men survived the terrible hardships of the bitter wintering at Valley Forge--and at Yorktown where Independence's victory was gained.

I know, proud Flag, you were not there; but, those men, those deeds are woven in the fabric that you wear.

I see a young man, captive on a British ship, after night-long battle, saw you, 'Star-Spangled', still flying proudly above a battered fort; and there your song was born. In masquerade, a single star, you waved above a lonely mission as brave men fought and died for freedom at the Alamo. You were there with dashing 'Teddy' as his Roughriders conquered San Juan Hill--and with our 'Doughboys' in the trenches of French battlefields as they fought and tipped the scale of victory 'Over There'. And then! that day of awful infamy when 'Rising Sun' erupted from the sky in treachery and brave men died without a chance to strike a blow in your defense. It seems beyond the bounds of possibility that you survived that dreadful moment; and yet, you staggered on and

slowly, surely gained your strength as battle after frightful battle was fought. And Oh! your day of glory came when Iwo Jima's sands were breached and, high upon the mountain, brave Marines raised your proud colors.

Oh! how I laughed and cheered and wept with pride to see you in your glory there above the smoke And guns and blazing bush and shattered earth And straining men whose efforts changed the battle's tide.

More pictures pass--and many are the deeds from history's pages that stir my memories. They are the bold threads of your tapestry, each one speaking of those 'Makers of the Flag' whose lives are the stuff of story and of legend. But, they are not all the threads, nor even most, because the tired, the poor, the weary, come home to us, are 'Makers of the Flag'. You raise the wheat--you mine the coal--you make the steelyou enforce the laws--you teach our children-you bring God's Word to us--you do all the things which must be done to make our country, this one we live in, great. You are truly 'Makers of the Flag'!

And so, I make my tribute to this Gallant Banner, which thrills me when I am in its presence and excites my deepest feelings when I sing its song. But, I also dedicate this tribute to each of you for your part in 'The Making of The Flag!'

### Why Scottish Rite?

What would you say if someone in your lodge asked you, "What can I get from the Scottish Rite that I cannot find in my Blue Lodge?" I've been a member of the Scottish Rite for over four years, and during that time I've been able to experience what makes us so special.

#### **Masonic Education**

The Scottish Rite is often called the "University of Masonry," but I suggest a more appropriate title would be the "Graduate School of Masonry." The three degrees of the Blue Lodge provide the solid foundation lessons of our fraternity. The 29 degrees of the Scottish Rite provide opportunities for the student of Freemasonry to build upon those teachings. The Scottish Rite places a heavy emphasis on education: the Master Craftsman I & II Programs are unique opportunities for deeper study, and the Scottish Rite Research Society provides scholarly publications and an outlet for members' thoughts and writings.

#### More Opportunities for Fellowship

The Scottish Rite, being regionally organized, provides more opportunities for fellowship. This broader membership provides unique opportunities for Scottish Rite Masons to expand their fellowship with more Masons than are within the walls of their lodges. With this comes more opportunities to involve our ladies and families.

#### **More Opportunities for Service**

The obligations undertaken by a Master Mason focus primarily on his responsibility's to the grand lodge, his lodge, and other Masons. However, the Scottish Rite Mason has undertaken further obligations to serve his broader community. In the 32nd Degree, the Scottish Rite Mason vows to serve as a "True Soldier" who seeks truth and knowledge, demands freedom of voice, vote, and opinion for all people, combats spiritual tyranny with

reason and truth, encourages men to be self-reliant and independent, and performs zealously his duties to God, his country, his family, his brethren, and himself.

In our Blue Lodges, we don aprons inherited from the traditions of the operative stonemasons, men who were builders, as we are called to be in our Blue Lodges. In the Scottish Rite, we are called to be soldiers and defenders, which is why we wear caps symbolic of the medieval tradition of knighthood. As Scottish Rite Masons, we are called to don our helmets, pick up our symbolic swords and shields, and live up to the obligations we have made.

#### More Opportunities to Practice Charity

Scottish Rite Masons proudly support the Scottish Rite RiteCare<sup>®</sup> Childhood Language Program. Whether it be through our donations of time or treasure, Scottish Rite Masons provide support to over 170 RiteCare<sup>®</sup> clinics throughout the Southern Jurisdiction in their mission of helping children communicate. The Scottish Rite also provides scholarships for deserving college students, honors those in JROTC and ROTC programs, and provides disaster relief in conjunction with the Masonic Services Association of North America. Further, each valley may have its own programs that help its community in special ways.


#### **Role Models & Mentors**
