From the Desk of the General Secretary

The substance of this article is important enough that we are drawing your attention again in this July-August 2022 issue so that no one can say they didn't see or read the article.

Brace yourselves Brethren. When the 2023 Dues statements arrive you will see a significant change. Our dues have been raised from \$150.00 to \$187.00 per year for 2023 and beyond. This change is brought about by the increased costs to the Valley for supplies, dinners and diminished income from investments plus per capita from Supreme.

As a result - the Valley has decided to increase the new annual dues of \$150 by \$37 to cover our out- of -pocket per capita assessments levied by Supreme Council in Washington, DC and the Orient of Washington (Rite Care and Scholarship Foundation).

It is a drastic change but one that is very necessary and, quite frankly, overdue. The dues increase will not affect our Life Members. However, all those LIFE Members who have purchased life memberships are asked to make a voluntary contribution of our \$37 per capita assessments. Annual dues are to be paid by December S1st each year.

We continue to work with outside vendors to expand our facility rental to offset our monthly/ yearly expenses: utilities - power, water, heat, A/C, natural gas, temple board expenses, janitorial, taxes, maintenance and insurance.



FREEDOM FROM ARROGANCE

Along with the current discussions of Freedom, there is one form which, if obtained, will give more happiness than all the others which are offered in the name of Security, a word that we have come to associate with our most precious heritage, but which must never be confused with such golden words as Freedom and Liberty.

This form of Freedom is "Freedom from Arrogance." No one can grant it. It must be achieved by the individual through an understanding of self, and a desire for self-improvement. We must then see ourselves in relation to all society.

Arrogance is a false shield. We use it foolishly to hide something of ourselves, yet it only serves as a crystal through which that very part of us becomes visible. Condescension and inferiority are no part of humility. Humility is the attribute of one who dwells neither on his perfection nor his imperfections. Humility is the art of being natural, of being kind, of being considerate of others. Humility is honesty. Humility makes brotherhood a reality through the understanding of our common faults.

Our Masonic Apron teaches us humility. Let us study that lesson of the Apron in order to become "properly clothed."

One who attains Freedom from Arrogance is in truth Free.



Independence Day!

Independence day is celebrated annually in the United States to recognize the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The document was meant to explain the reasons why the thirteen (13) British colonies of the Americas chose to separate from England. Some scholars believe the document was not signed until August 2nd, 1776. Although writings from Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson and John Hancock all say they signed the Declaration on July 4th, 1776.

Independence day, in fact the American Revolution itself holds a special place for American Freemasons. We tend to hold up the fact George Washington, Benjamin Franklin and various members of the Sons of Liberty were leaders in the Revolution. Although it is true nine (9) Freemasons (out of 56), signed the Declaration of Independence, including it's most famous signer, John Hancock. It is not so much the men who made the impact on the Revolution. It is the principals of Freemasonry which helped to form the United States of America.

Some scholars point to the publication Anderson's Constitutions as a source for those ideals. Some of the ideals and codes of conduct which we find in Anderson's Constitutions later appear in the United States Constitution. A common example is the prohibition on Religion as a topic of conversation in a lodge room where business is discussed. It is seen as a source of division within the lodge. Similarly, it can be equally said, Religion in Government causes the same division in our ruling bodies, not allowing Government to properly govern for all of it's people.

For the Declaration of Independence and the events which lead to it, those who know the lessons our ritual inculcates, it is obvious to see where the men

who helped form the early United States believed in those principals, mason or not. As an example, Freemason's believe we all meet upon the level, the Declaration of Independence states "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal".

In the end Washington, Franklin, Hancock and the list of other notable and not so notable members of the American Revolution who were Freemasons, put themselves in harms way for their belief in a better future. It becomes less about those men and more about the ideals and principals, many of which are put forth by Freemasonry in the United States and around the World. Those same ideals are stated in our ritual over and over again, not to make them common place, but to remind us of the importance of those words which inspired revolutions, in the Untied States and beyond.

As we celebrate the birth of the United States we should remember it was those Freemasons involved in the Revolution who had the courage to risk their lives for an ideal. It was in a Freemason lodge where they heard those ideals put forth and where they were reminded of them to the point they became a part of their lives. A gift which is now ours to cherish and pass on in our Freemason Lodges and in our communities.

To my American brethren Happy Fourth of July! May it be safe and filled with family and friends!

To my brethren around the world, may the ideals of Justice, Freedom and Equality be ever present in your lodges and communities.

The History of Freemasons For the Month of July/August

July 12—In 1864, Brother Frank Baldwin, then a Captain, CoD in the 19th Michigan Infantry captured two Confederate Officers and their regimental guidon. His act of bravery won him his first Medal of Honor. His second would be earned in 1874. Brother Baldwin was a member of Siloam Lodge No. 35 in Constantine, Michigan

July 16—In 1945, the atomic bomb was first tested at Alamogordo, New Mexico. The successful test proved that the US possessed the most destructive weapon ever devised by humans. The explosion, seen up to 50 miles (80 km) away, created a massive orange and yellow cloud in the shape of a mushroom that billowed upward. The atomic bomb was the result of a secret US effort called "The Manhattan Project" ordered into development earlier by President and Bro. Franklin Delano Roosevelt. It was Bro. Harry S Truman who ordered the bomb dropped on the city of Hiroshima Japan less than a month later (on August 10). Sixteen hours later Bro. Truman called upon on the Japanese to surrender. Japan did not respond and two days later Nagasaki suffered the same fate. On September 2, Japan formally surrendered to representatives of the allied powers led by General and Bro. Douglas MacArthur, thus ending world War II.

July 18—Born - Bro. Red Skelton, comedian-actor (The Red Skelton Show) in Vincennes, IN. Vaudevillian and radio performer Red Skelton hosted several popular variety shows on NBC and CBS in a career that spanned 20 years. He was a gifted comedian, famous for his looney characters, sight gags, pantomimes and ad libs. His show was also notable for introducing Johnny Carson and Rolling Stones to a national audience Bro. Skeleton was raised in Vincennes lodge 1, Vincennes, Indiana in 1939.

July 20—In 1944, President and Bro. Franklin Delano Roosevelt was nominated for an unprecedented fourth term at the Democratic convention. He was a member of New York's Holland Lodge No. 8. Nominated to be his running mate as Vice President was the feisty Bro. Harry S Truman, former Grand Master of Masons in Missouri Bro. Roosevelt was to run against - and beat - former New York Governor Bro. Thomas E. Dewey, a member of New York City's Karie Lodge No. 454.

August 1—In 1923, in a hotel in San Francisco, Bro. Warren G. Harding, the 29th US President, died of a stroke at the age of 58. Bro. Harding had been on a transcontinental journey that some believed he had embarked on to escape rumors of corruption in his administration. After his death, investigations revealed the rumors were true, and the scandal became known as Teapot Dome. Bro. Harding was initiated in Marion Lodge No. 70, Marion, OH on June 28, 1901. He was passed to FC 19 years later on August 13, 1920, and raised MM August 27, 1920. On May 4, 1921 he was made an Honorary Member of Albert Pike Lodge No 36, Washington, DC, and an Honorary Member of America Lodge No. 3368, London, England, in 1922. A member of Marion Lodge No. 63 (RAM), he was Knighted in Marion Commandery No. 36, Knights Templar, on March 1, 1921. He had been awarded a 33degree in the Scottish Rite but died before receiving it. When he joined Aladdin Shrine Temple of Columbus, OH, he would be the first US President to become a Shrine Mason. At his death his body was conducted from the White House to the Capitol by six Commanderies of Washington, DC (Knights Templar). The asphalt container in which his body was placed was the gift of Boumi Shine Temple of Baltimore MD.

August 18—In 1979, 2 Georgia EA's were passed to the Fellowcraft degree in Union Lodge No. 38's annual Cave Degree. In attendance were 350 Masons from 14 states as well as Canada. On the same date in 1984, a MM Degree was performed at the same location. 260 Masons from 9 states attended. On the same date in 1990 a MM Degree was again conferred. In attendance were 268 Masons from 21 states as well as Mexico and Germany. On the same date in 2001 a MM Degree was again conferred with 192 masons attending from 13 states. The degree will next fall on this date in 2007.

August 30—In 1865 General Albert Pike is granted amnesty by President Andrew Johnston. He had been previously in Canada as he had not been granted amnesty by Lincoln's amnesty proclamation.
