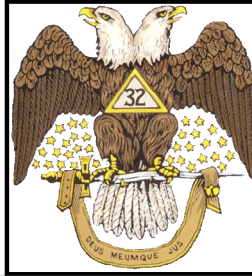

From the Desk of the General Secretary

Brace yourselves Brethren! When you receive your 2022 Dues statements you will see a significant change. Our dues have been raised from \$100 to \$150.00 per year for 2022, thereafter in 2023 \$187 and 2024 \$187+/- they are increasing by the per capita assessed by the Supreme Council 33° in Washington, DC. This increase was necessary due to our annual cost for insurance, taxes, utilities, supplies, dinners and building associated costs.

We have recently been permitted to open our cooking facilities with the Snohomish Health District as a Commissary Kitchen – this will allow us to rent out the kitchen to outside vendors.

These are drastic changes, but are very necessary and, quite frankly, overdue. The dues increase will not affect our Life Members however, they will all be asked to voluntarily submit the annual per capita assessment (now approximately \$32-\$34 plus \$5 for Orient of Washington per year). Box 1 – Everett Valley Dues; Box 2 – Rite Care, and Box 3 – Scholarship Foundation.

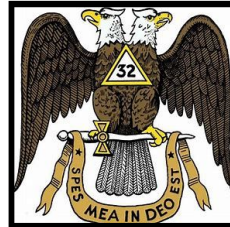
Now may be the time for you to consider purchasing a Life Membership. If you are 75 or older it is \$500. If you are under the age of 75 it is \$750.

This coming September we will also see a change in our dinners. The Monday night buffet will remain at \$10 per person and our catered dinners may increase to \$20.00 per person (or more depending on the meal). The catered dinners are dinners that require an RSVP for attendance.

Let's hope that the economy changes and we can realize some stabilization in our income and expenses. The more members we have, the less our overhead costs will be. We will be conferring the 4° on October 4th, 2021 followed by the 14° on November 1st, 2021 and 18° on December 6th, 2021. You still have time to get those petitions in – as we can conduct balloting on September 20th, 2021. Should you have any questions – please give me a call at 425-610-4561.
