From the Desk of the General Secretary

What is the Feast of Tishri?

The Masonic calendar is based on the ancient Hebrew calendar, which is a lunar calendar where a month goes from new moon to new moon. The Biblical *civil* New Year starts in *Rosh haShanah* ('Head of the Year' or 'Beginning of the Year'), in the seventh month, Tishri (*teeshray*), which is a celebration month (High Holy Days), corresponding to parts of September and October.

The Temple of Jerusalem, built by Solomon, King of Israel, was also dedicated during the month of Tishri. Some Scottish Rite Bodies around the world observe the *Feast of Tishri*, as a feast of thanksgiving to perpetuate the Biblical memory. No other occasion epitomizes the character and purpose of Freemasonry more wholly than this historic celebration of the dedication of King Solomon's Temple, the first edifice built for God.

The origin of the Feast of Tishri (also known as the Feast of the Tabernacle) is described in the Old Testament where it is said that the Lord spoke unto Moses saying when "ye [shall] have gathered in the fruit of the land, ye shall keep a feast unto the LORD seven days: [and] Ye shall dwell in booths seven days.... That your generations may know that I

made of Israel to dwell in booths, when I brought them out of the land of Egypt" Leviticus 23:39, 42-43. The origins and significances of the Feast of Tishri make it the most Scottish Rite of festivals. Although originally celebrated as a harvest and gathering festival, no other occasion epitomizes the character and purpose of the Rite more wholly than our historic celebration, held in conjunction with the dedication of King Solomon's Temple (2 Chronicles 7:8-10). To marshal the meanings of the feast is to summarize the principal ideals and traditions of our Fraternity.

We observe the Feast of Tishri because it is an age-old custom which now has the power of law. Under the Statutes of the Supreme Council, the feast is considered an obligatory observance, a sharing of our fraternal spirit.

The Valley of Everett will be having a dinner honoring the Feast of Tishri on Monday, October 17, 2022 at the Scottish Rite Temple in Everett, Washington. Punch bowl at 6:30 PM, Dinner at 7:00 PM.

The History of Freemasons For the Month of October

October 1—In 1908 Bro. Henry Ford introduced His Model T for \$850. While Bro. Ford introduced his "Model; T" for \$850, by 1924 he was selling them for as little as \$260. Between 1908 and 1927 Bro. Ford sold just over 15-million "Model Ts" in the U.S. Although the first "Model Ts" were not built on the assembly line, the demand for the car got so high that Bro. Ford developed a system where workers remained at their stations and cars came to them. This enabled Bro. Ford's company to turn out a "Model T" every 10 seconds. From 1914 onwards he operated a revolutionary profit-sharing plan for his workers. Bro. Ford was raised in Palestine Lodge 357, Detroit, MI, in 1894

October 8—In 1890 was born Bro. Edward V. Rickenbacker, WW One Flying Ace In Columbus, OH. After a stint as an auto racer he became a flyer and during World War One commanded the 94th Hero Pursuit Squadron, becoming America's leading "Ace." He became President of Eastern Airlines after the war but on the outbreak of World War II returned to the military and was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross with nine clusters and the Congressional Medal of Honor for his bravery on special missions. He was a member of Kilwinning Lodge 297 in Detroit, MI. He died July 23, 1973, at Zurich, Switzerland.

October 14—In 1912, just after a gunman's bullet lodged in his chest during a campaign visit to Milwaukee, WI, Bro. Theodore (Teddy) Roosevelt stood for 80 minutes to deliver the message of his Progressive "Bull Moose" Party. "Friends," he said upon reaching the podium, "I shall ask you to be as quiet as possible. I don't know whether you fully understand that I have been shot. But,. you see, it takes more than that to kill a Bull Moose. Bro. Roosevelt recovered, largely because the bullet was slowed by an overcoat, a glasses case, and a folded manuscript of his speech. Would be-assassin John Chrank was taken into custody. Bro. Roosevelt was raised at Matinecck Lodge 806 at Oyster Bay, NY and made an honorary member of Pentalpha Lodge23 at Washington, D.C., where he took part in numerous Masonic activities.

October 17—In 1919, Bro. David Sarnoff created the Radio Corporation of America (RCA). All of Bro. David Sarnoff's life was spent in the radio industry, first with the Marconi Company and then with the Radio Corporation of America, of which he became President at age 39. Bro. Sarnoff became known as "The Father of American Television." He entered Freemasonry in 1921 at New York City's Strict Observance Lodge 94

October 23—In 1946, thanks to Bro. Harry S Truman, the United Nations General Assembly convened in New York for the first time. The United Nations (UN), international organization established immediately after World War II. replaced the failed League of Nations. One reason the League of Nations failed was the refusal of the United States to join. US President and Bro. Truman ensured this mistake would not be repeated. "We had sponsored and helped establish the United Nations Organization," he said, in signing the UN Charter for the United States. "hoping to prevent the too often recurring plague of humanity - war." When the UN was founded, there were 51 members; 188 nations are now members of the organization.

October 27—In 1858 in New York was born the man who was to become the 26th President of the United States, succeeding to the presidency on the death of Bro. William McKinley. His term of office began on September 14, 1901 and ended March 3, 1909. Bro. Theodore Roosevelt was the first president to ride in an automobile (1902), the first to submerge in a submarine (1905) and to fly in an airplane (1910). He is best remembered for the quote: "Speak softly but carry a big stick." But he also said: "The first requisite of a good citizen in this Republic of ours is that he shall be able and willing to pull his weight." Bro. Roosevelt was initiated January 2, 1801,. passed March 27, and raised April 24 the same year at Matinecock Lodge 806 at Oyster Bay, NY. He was made an honorary member of Pentalpha Lodge 23 at Washington, DC where he took an active part in many Masonic activities. He died at Oyster Bay, NY on January 6, 1919. His last words were: "Put out the light."

October 31—In 1941 the faces of Bro. George Washington, Bro. Theodore Roosevelt, Thomas Jefferson and Abraham Lincoln began to look over the Black Hills of South Dakota unencumbered by scaffolding and laborers. Unhappily, its designer, sculptor Bro. John Guzon de la Mothe Borglum died on March 6, at age 71, leaving the project to be completed by his son, Bro. Lincoln Borglum. An active Mason, Bro. Borglum was raised in Howard Lodge 35 in New York City on June 10, 1904, and served as its Master in 1910-11. There is a colossal marble head of Lincoln by Borglum in the rotunda of the Capitol of Washington, DC. His son, Bro. Lincoln Borglum was raised in Battle River Lodge 92 at Hermosa, South Dakota.

Feast of Tishri Monday, October 17, 2022

Feast of Tishri Event

The Feast of Tishri is the title that the Scottish Rite adopted as one of the recognized formal affairs in Scottish Rite Masonry. The significance of the Feast of Tishri rests on three factors: First, the wandering of the children of Israel in the wilderness for forty years; Second, the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple; and Third, the Harvesting Time and Thanksgiving to God for His Blessing and Bounty.

Scottish Rite Recognition

In 1866, the Supreme Council of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States proclaimed the Feast of Tabernacles as the Feast Day of the Lodge of Perfection, the 15th day of Tishri, (October) which we, the Valley of Everett, celebrate on the Monday of October 17th. As did the Israelites of old and the New England Pilgrims, Scottish Rite Freemasons gather to acknowledge the mercies which God has poured upon them with Freemasonry adds 4,000 years to our current calenlavish hands. It is a time of rejoicing, yet a time to pay humble adoration to the Great Architect of the Universe, without whom there would be no harvest.

Wandering Israelites

As the children of Israel were led through the wilderness, God decreed the celebration of a sevenday feast in the Jewish month of Tishri, during which they were to live in sukkah "succoth". In the Book of Leviticus, The Lord spoke unto Moses and said the 15th day of the 7th month, namely "Tishri", when the people had gathered in the fruits of the land, they should "Feast Unto The Lord", while dwelling in sukkah, booths or tents. All three words mean temporary dwellings made from branches, twigs and canvas or cloth, and garlanded with citrus fruits. This feast was to be celebrated annually to forever remind the Israelites that He had rescued them from Egypt. This "Feast of Tishri" (or "Feast of Succoth") is thus a symbol of freedom. When King Solomon completed his Temple

more than four centuries later, it was dedicated during the Feast of Tishri, and this association led to its adoption by Scottish Rite Masonry to symbolize our dedication to brotherly love and human accord in a peaceful world.

Completion/Dedication of the Temple

Deut. 16:13—Thou shalt observe the feast of tabernacles after thou hast gathered in thy corn and wine. The Feast of Tabernacles also commemorates the ceremonies of the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple, which began in the year 2992 A.L.*, and finished in a little more than seven years. Six months after its completion, in the month of Tishri—the seventh month of the Jewish calendar—the temple was dedicated with reverential ceremonies to the one Living and True God. That these ceremonies would reach the highest religious significance, King Solomon postponed the dedication until the Feast of Tabernacles, the 15th day of Tishri, a day he well knew would bring every zealous Israelite to Jerusalem. * Anno Luciusdar year (example: 2022 becomes 6022 A.L.).

Harvesting Time/Thanksgiving to the Lord

When King Solomon dedicated the first Temple, he was not dedicating a mere structure, he was praying for all mankind. It is the Brotherhood of Man that is the very cornerstone of our Masonic Brotherhood and philosophy. We, therefore, can give thanks to the Great Architect of the Universe and celebrate this Feast Day as a Feast of Scottish Rite Masonic Thanksgiving. We can thank Our Creator for our many blessings: home, family, friends and for a Country where we enjoy religious and political freedoms even greater than our Forefathers ever dreamed. It is no accident we call ourselves "FREE" MASONS, for we believe in the freedoms our Founding Fathers established for our Country. We must, therefore, rededicate ourselves to maintaining those freedoms by putting into practice the virtues we have learned.

Director of Works



Feast of Tishri

As the children of Israel were led through the wilderness, God decreed the celebration of a seven day feast in the Jewish month of Tishri, during which they were to live in "sukkahs" (shelters or Booths) – He decreed that this feast be celebrated annually to forever re-



mind the Israelites that He had rescued them from Egypt. This "Feast of Tishri" (or "Feast of Succoth") is thus a symbol of freedom. Some 450 years after its origin, the Feast of Tishri was utilized in dedicating the newly completed King Solomon's Temple, and this association led to its adoption by Scottish Rite Masonry to symbolize our dedication to brotherly love and human accord in a peaceful world.

This adaptation is evidenced in lessons taught by the Third-Degree lecture (Blue

Lodge), wherein we learn that David, King of Israel, was denied the privilege of building the Temple of God due to the "many wars and much bloodshed" associated with his reign. On his death, Solomon (his son) ascended the throne and brought peace and tranquility in the world through wisdom and righteousness—

God thus chose him to perform "so great and glorious an undertaking" as that denied David. And so it was that through Solomon, construction of the Temple was seemingly guided by the hand of God – for indeed it was. Association of the Feast of Tishri with the dedication of the Temple of Solomon led to its third name – the "Feast of the Tabernacle". The Feast of Tishri thus epitomizes the character, principles and purposes of Scottish Rite Masonry, all being consistent with the dictates of the God who spoke it into existence.

Almoner's Fund

The Almoner is an elected officer of the Scottish Rite whose duty is to dispense the charities of the Lodge. The recipient is never aware of the source of the aid. True charity happens without fanfare or recognition of the source. The various expenditures are an investment made to assist those in need by giving them a feeling of security, and knowing that someone cares enough to give their time and money to help lift their worries. Maintaining the Almoner's fund is the duty of each member of the Scottish Rite and exemplifies the three principle tenets of Masonry – Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

When attending meetings, Scottish Rite Masons will hear the injunction by the Almoner re-

garding the contributions; no brother is expected to leave without making his contribution. This is in no way intended to embarrass a brother, but to remind him of his duty. Many brethren who are unable to attend meetings have not overlooked this important Masonic duty by including a contribution for the Almoner when they pay their dues.
