

his *De architectura* and brief notes from contempo-79). Vitruvius was known as a military engineer he was involved in and referenced in *De architec*-

tura, he is believed to have traveled in Julius Caesar. Doesn't this echo the backgrounds of Sir Robert Moray (1608-1673) and Elias Ashmole (1617-1692)? Vitruvius was first and foremost an architect. The etymology of the term "architect" means "master" and "builder" – terms we as speculative Masons are quite familiar with. But in First Century Rome, the term had a broader meaning than is associated with it today: it included architecture, construction management, construction engineering chemical engineering, civil engineering, materials engineering, military engineering and urban planning.

Through the adoption of Vitruvian sensibilities in the Renaissance, understanding the elements of classical architecture was considered essential to a gentleman's education. It balanced intellectual knowledge and theory with practical. Vitruvius argued that an architect must have knowledge of geometry for preparing plans (the use of rulers, compasses, squares, levels and plumb lines); optics for placing windows; physics to understand the flow of water and air; music for the construction of theaters, building water organs and adjusting the tension of ropes on war machines; medicine to assess the healthiness of building sites and water supplies; law to draw up enforceable contracts and astronomy to align buildings and build sun-dials. In sum, the Vitruvian architect was the master of all the arts central to human knowledge – the Universal Man.

During the middle ages, it was presumed that man could not imitate or dominate nature and should not try to do so, because there was no need to compete with God. Suggesting the ability to dominate or otherwise control nature or bend it to our will was viewed as blasphemous. But Vitruvius gave men in the Renaissance confidence in man's potential power over nature. And, by the sixteenth century, gunpowder, the magnetic compass and the printing press pushed society well beyond the limits imposed by medieval church orthodoxy.

According to Vitruvius, a structure must exhibit three qualities: stability, utility and beauty. These are termed the Vitruvian virtues or the Vitruvian Triad. Does this sound familiar? Vitruvius described the human figure as being the principal source of all proportion. How many can recall da Vinci's illustration of the human body inscribed in a circle and the square: the Vitruvian recall da Vinci's illustration of the human body inscribed in a circle and the square: the Vitruvian Man? What Vitruvian was essentially implying is that symmetry of the human body reflects the symmetry of the universe as a whole: "as above, so below".

Absorbing Vitruvian sensibilities into general cultural background at the dawn of the Enlightenment, operative masons saw themselves as Vitruvian architects, blending mathematical skills with astronomy. During this period of time math, alchemy and astrology were the fields generally discussed by operative masons and gentlemen of learning, but these monikers should not be viewed as derisive. Alchemy, for instance, was not really the pursuit of turning physical lead into physical gold, but entailed the symbolic pursuit of perfecting the soul – often outside the limitations imposed by the Church.

In developing the notion that the architect had to balance theory with practical knowledge lead operative masons to the reasonably conclusion that they had something to learn from the philosopher and much valuable practical experience to teach the philosopher. This naturally lead to the idea that differences in social rank were irrelevant in the lodge – philosophers and artisans were united in the quest for knowledge and each had something to offer the other.

It could be argued that this idea drew men of education and privilege to the operative lodges, believing that the operative lodges held secrets that might embody valuable knowledge, both occult and practical, that speculative masons could find enrichment.

The adoption of Vitruvian ideals certainly inspired operative masons at the beginning of the period we call the Enlightenment and exalted the craft from journeymen laborers to bearers of esoteric knowledge. Certainly Vitruvian application of knowledge with practical skills fit nicely into the emerging values of the Enlightenment.

THE MASONIC CONNECTION TO THANKSGIVING

As we celebrate Thanksgiving it's important to reflect on the history of this holiday. Two Freemasons heavily shaped the celebration that we know today. Bro. Elias Boudinot and former President and Freemason George Washington rallied together to create this holiday as a way to give thanks and prayer to our communities, families, and friends.



The Masonic Connection

In 1621, the settlers from the Mayflower created a tradition that would last for centuries to come. This celebration was to thank God for the harvest and his many blessings. Members of the Wampanoag tribe in Plymouth, Massachusetts were also invited to the feast. This feast is what we now call Thanksgiving where we are pushed to reflect on all that we have to be grateful for.

On September 25th, 1789 Congressman and Brother Elias Boudinot of Burlington, New Jersey appeared in front of the House of Representatives with a proposition. Brother Boudinot asked that the government create a committee to persuade the President and Freemason, George Washington, to declare a national day of thanks and prayer. Without his Masonic values, Brother Boudinot may have never been inclined to rally for this national day of thanks.

In 1789, President George Washington delivered the Proclamation of 1789 that assigned November 26th as the National Holiday of Thanks-

giving. This proclamation was also a symbol to our former monarchy that the colonies were a self -governing and legitimate state. Washington remarked, "both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness."

It goes without doubt that our national holiday of Thanksgiving would not have been established without the help of two Freemasons. Brother Elias Boudinot and President George Washington are two strong foundations of our Thanksgiving tradition. As Freemasons, we should take this time to practice gratitude for our fellow Brethren, lodges, and local communities. Happy Thanksgiving from the From The Valley of Everett Scottish Rite Masons.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Hiram Abiff Boaz was born on December 18, 1866 at Murray Kentucky. He moved to Texas at an early age. In 1891 he was ordained a Methodist minister. In 1922 he was elected a Bishop at the church. He became a member Granger Lodge #677 of Texas. When he received his third degree, a large crowd attended because of his unusual name of the new member. He served as Grand Chaplain of Texas in 1953.



This Brother had many interesting experiences connected with his name. He never tired telling the tale of the time he as traveling in the Holy Land and arrived at a Mosque of Hebron on the wrong day for visitors. When he told them his name was Boaz, it seemed as if he had given a magic password. Others were not admitted that day, but they opened the gates for him.



The History of Freemasons For the Month of November

November 2—In 1865 was born at Corsica, OH Warren G. Harding, the man who was to become the 29h President of the United States. His term of office began March 4, 1921, and lasted until August 2, 1923, when he died suddenly while on a western speaking tour. His undistinguished administration was tainted by the Teapot Dome Scandal. He was initiated June 18, passed August 13, and raised August 23, 1920. He became an honorary member of Albert Pike Lodge 36 at Washington, D.C. in 1921. He was also a member of the Mark and Royal Arch, a Knight Templar and a 33-degree Mason of the Scottish Rite. He was the first President to become a Shrine Mason.

November 5—In 1912 "King of the Cowboys" Roger was born Leonard Slye at Cincinnati, OH. His many songs included "Don't Fence Me In," and "Happy Trails To You." He made his acting debuting "Under Western Stars": in 1935 and later hosted his own show, "The Roy Rogers show," in 1951. Bro. Rogers died at Apple Valley, CA, July 6, 1998. Bro. Rogers was a member of Hollywood Lodge 355, Hollywood, CA.

November 6—In 1854 was born in Washington, D.C., the Mason who was to become America's "March King" for such rousers as "The Stars and Stripes forever," "Semper Fidelis,"" El Capitan,"Nobles of the Mystic Shrine," ":Washington Post" and others. From 1880 to 1892 he led the band of the US. Marine Corps and later his own band. "The March King" exerted a tremendous influence on martial music.; He was a member of Hiram Lodge 10 at Washington, DC. Bro. Sousa died at reading, PA. March 6 1932.

November 7—In 1805, after a perilous journey of nearly 4,000- miles, Bro. Meriwether Lewis and Bro. William Clark and their expedition across the US arrived at the Pacific Ocean. The expedition left Fort Mandan on the upper Missouri River on April 7 in six canoes and two large piroques. Bro. Clark was variously a member of Virginia City Lodge No. 1, Morning Star Lodge No. 5, Helena, and Deer Lodge No. 14, Deer City, MT.. He was Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Montana in 1877. Bro. Lewis was raised at Door to Virtue Lodge No. 44, Albermarle County, VA in 1797. Door to Virtue went dark in 1801 and Bro. Lewis transferred to Staunton Lodge, Staunton, VA where he received the Royal Arch degree. Thanks Bro. Ed Verdi for the tip.

November 11– In 1975, Justice and Bro. William O. Douglas Retires from the Supreme Court. Appointed in 1939 to the US Supreme Court by President and Bro. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Justice and Bro. William O. Douglas was the longest-serving justice in Supreme Court history when he retired on November 12, 1975. In his more than 36 years of service, he was known for his commitment to the rights of the individual and his distrust of unrestrained government power. A conservationist and nature-lover, he was a powerful advocate for environmental protection.

November 19—In 1483 at Eisleban, Saxony, was born the Augustan monk Martin Luther, a founder and leader of the Reformation and of Protestantism. Luthe tacked his 95 thesis on "the Power of Indulgences" to the door of Wittenberg's castle church on October 31, 1517, the eve of All Saints Day. These called for a reformation of the abuses by the Roman Catholic Church which got him excommunicated. He was known to have been a member of the "guild at Steinmetzen" in Germany, rumored to be then a Masonic Lodge in disguise. He died near his birthplace on February 18, 1546, he was the founder of Lutheranism.

November 19—In 1971, the Long Beach Scottish Rite Bodies honored Audie Murphy by naming their class of 124 candidates the Audie Murphy Memorial Class. Murphy's film, "To Hell and Back" was shown instead of the 31st Degree.

November 29—In 1992 Author John J. Robinson (Born in Blood) spoke at the Grand Lodge of Missouri. He was a guest of the Education Committee. Robinson did not become a Freemason until after his third book, "A Pilgrim's Path."

November 30—In 1874 Winston Churchill was born. Although Churchill attended lodge regularly, he never held Masonic office.

Payment must be

made prior to receiving any of the Scottish Rite Degrees.



The chaos, the hardship, the dread and fear, The poverty, distress, the undried tear, While we have everything of the best, With this world's goods we're truly blest.


Yes, Thanksgiving time is here once more, Did you sit right down and tally the score? If you did, like good Masons you'll start from here And practice your teachings without let or fear,
