To any Valley of Everett Scottish Rite Brother who may need the reminder to who may have not yet remitted their 2026 Valley of Everett annual dues.

Your Annual Dues to the Valley of Everett are due by December 31^s each year. Paying after January 1st or beyond means you are paying late.

If you don't pay on time, you are creating extra work for the Valley Secretary to reach out to you, as we incur postage and late notice fees from Supreme Council.

Most Valleys I know are also struggling with finances while trying to keep dues affordable for all brothers. As of this date, our records indicate 31 or 18.6% have paid their 2026 dues. 46 or 27.5 % have yet to pay their 2026 dues assessment. We now have 68 Endowed Life Members

We are carrying nine (9) members who are unable to pay their dues for various reasons most likely attributable to their ages/disabilities and identified as senior exempt along with seven (7) who have reached the milestone of 50+ years and no longer are required or liable for annual dues.

Unfortunately, we have five (5) who are due from 2024-2025 and 2026. In all likelihood these brothers may be suspended for non-payment of dues.

Please just be considerate of everyone involved and pay your dues on time. If you are struggling

(particularly this year) and need the Valley of Everett's relief, then just communicate that to me as Valley Secretary at 425-610- 4561, ahead of time (*rather than making us chase you down*). If you don't want to retain your membership in the Valley of Everett it is better to demit rather than forcing regular dues paying members pay the per capita for someone who isn't paying dues to the Orient of Washington Rite Care; Scholarship Foundation and Supreme Council 33° in Washington, DC . As long as your dues are current this would be the time for you to consider a request for a demit or address some possible alternatives.

Masonic Ties in the Marine Corps

As we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States Marine Corps on November 10th, we find, as with other branches of the military, that the fraternal bonds are strong.

The U.S. Marine Corps was established in the historic Tun Tavern in Philadelphia, a location also significant for hosting the first recorded Masonic meeting in 1731. Samuel Nicholas, the tavern's innkeeper and a member of the Lodge, became its Junior Warden and was commissioned as a Captain of Marines by the Continental Congress in 1775. He recruited two battalions of Marines from Tun Tavern and is recognized as the first Commandant of the Marine Corps, holding the rank of Major.

During the War of 1812, Lieutenant William S. Bush commanded the Marine Guard onboard the USS Constitution. Brother Bush was a member of Lodge No. 51 of the RW Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. He joined the Marines in 1809 and was posted to the USS Constitution. During the engagement with the HMS Guerriere on August 19, 1812, he was killed by British rifle fire, becoming the first Marine officer to be killed in combat.

After the turn of the century, one Freemason Marine demonstrated heroism well beyond that normally attributed to an elite fighting force. Smedley Butler is one of only a few Marines to be awarded two Medals of Honor for separate heroic acts. He received his first medal for his service in Veracruz, Mexico, in 1914 and his second for actions during the U.S. occupation of Haiti in 1915.

Freemasonry grew in the Corps during the First World War and in the years following. Three future Commandants of the U.S. Marine Corps became Freemasons in Overseas Lodge No. 40 in Coblenz during its brief existence: General John A. Lejeune, for whom Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, NC, and John A. Lejeune Lodge No. 350 in Quantico, VA, were named; General Wendell C. Neville; and General Lemuel C. Shepherd. General Shepherd later recounted to Major General Wilkerson the story of General Lejeune's initiation, which originated in the Second Army Division when General Lejeune commanded it.

"General Lejeune is reported to have called his driver and told him he was going to Coblenz. When he named the hour of departure, the driver's face fell. 'I was going to ask if I could get off this afternoon, sir,' he said. 'No, you had better come along,' the General replied, 'You will have plenty of time to yourself in Coblenz.' 'Yes sir,' said the driver, although he was not



wholly cheerful. 'Where to, sir?' he asked as they entered Coblenz about three o'clock that afternoon. The driver gave his chief a peculiar look as he nodded that he understood. At the gate in front of the Temple, General Lejeune tarried a moment to tell the driver to be back promptly at seven o'clock. 'But, sir,' was the smiling reply, 'I also have been notified to report here this afternoon,' and together they entered the Temple to take their First De-

grees."¹

Generals Lejeune and Shepherd were raised in this same Lodge on the same night. When General Shepherd, then a company commander, submitted his petition, he was sponsored and coached by the company gunnery sergeant. He later reflected, "Thus did Overseas Lodge develop and strengthen a fellowship between men of all ranks in the Army and the Marine Corps."¹

Freemasons were well represented in the Second World War by several Marines. No fewer than seven Freemasons obtained commissions as General Officers. There were at least two Medal of Honor and five Navy Cross recipients, and numerous Silver and Bronze Stars for valor awarded to Brothers. These Masons saw action from the opening days of the Battle of Guadalcanal to the final days on Okinawa.

After the war, the United States set its sights on space. The first American to orbit the Earth was Marine astronaut John Glenn. Illustrious Brother Glenn, 33°, first petitioned Concord Lodge No. 688 in his hometown of New Concord, Ohio, but did not pursue the degrees at that time. He was made a "Mason at Sight" by the Grand Master of Ohio on August 19, 1978, and later completed his Scottish Rite Degrees at the Valley of Cincinnati. During his final journey to space in 1998, he wore his 33° ring and made history as the oldest man to travel to space at the age of 77.

As we reflect on the enduring legacy of the United States Marine Corps and its deep fraternal ties, we honor not only the valor of its warriors but also the shared values of brotherhood, service, and integrity that unite Masons and Marines across generations. These stories remind us that the bonds forged in ritual and battle alike continue to shape the character of our nation's defenders—and inspire us to uphold those ideals in our own lives.

The History of Freemasons For the Month of November

November 2 - In 1865 was born at Corsica, OH Warren G. Harding, the man who was to become the 29th President of the United States. His term of office began March 4, 1921, and lasted until August 2, 1923, when he died suddenly while on a western speaking tour. His undistinguished administration was tainted by the Teapot Dome Scandal. He was initiated June 18, passed August 13, and raised August 23, 1920. He became an honorary member of Albert Pike Lodge 36 at Washington, D.C. in 1921. He was also a member of the Mark and Royal Arch, a Knight Templar and a 33-degree Mason of the Scottish Rite. He was the first President to become a Shrine Mason.

November 6—In 1854 was born in Washington, D.C., the Mason who was to become America's "March King" for such rousers as "The Stars and Stripes forever," "Semper Fidelis," "El Capitan," "Nobles of the Mystic Shrine," "Washington Post" and others. From 1880 to 1892 he led the band of the US Marine Corps and later his own band. "The March King" exerted a tremendous influence on martial music.; He was a member of Hiram Lodge 10 at Washington, DC. Bro. John Phillip Sousa died at Reading, PA. March 6, 1932.

November 11—In 1975, Justice and Bro. William O. Douglas Retires from the Supreme Court. Appointed in 1939 to the US Supreme Court by President and Bro. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Justice and Bro. William O. Douglas was the longest-serving justice in Supreme Court history when he retired on November 12, 1975. In his more than 36 years of service, he was known for his commitment to the rights of the individual and his distrust of unrestrained government power. A conservationist and nature-lover, he was a powerful advocate for environmental protection.

November 12—In 1894 the foundation stone of the Detroit Masonic Temple was laid. This Temple would be replaced by the present Temple, the largest in the world, which replaced it in 1926.


November 19—In 1971, the Long Beach Scottish Rite Bodies honored Audie Murphy by naming their class of 124 candidates the Audie Murphy Memorial Class. Murphy's film, "To Hell and Back" was shown instead of the 31st Degree.

Feast of Tishri Celebration

On October 20, 2025, The Valley of Everett celebrated the Feast of the Tabernacle or the Feast of Tishri.

The **Feast of Tishri** is a significant celebration rooted in both Jewish tradition and Masonic practice, particularly within the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry as described below.

Jewish Origins

- The Feast of Tishri corresponds to **Sukkot**, the biblical **Feast of Tabernacles**, celebrated on the **15th day of the Hebrew month of Tishri**.
- It commemorates: The **Israelites' 40-year journey** through the wilderness.
- Their dwelling in **sukkot** (temporary shelters made of branches and cloth).
- The **harvest season**, giving thanks to God for abundance.

Masonic Significance

- In **Scottish Rite Freemasonry**, the Feast of Tishri is one of the most important formal observances.
- It symbolizes: **Freedom and divine protection**, echoing the Exodus.
- The **dedication of King Solomon's Temple**,

which was completed and consecrated during this feast.

- A time of **thanksgiving and reflection**, similar to the American Thanksgiving.

These holidays emphasize **introspection, repentance, and renewal**, aligning with Masonic values of self-improvement and brotherhood.



MASONIC BIOGRAPHIES

David Rice Atchison, The 15th Masonic President of the United States

Senator David Rice Atchison (Born August 11, 1817. Died on January 26, 1886) was a mid-19th-century Democratic United States Senator from Missouri. He served as president pro tempore of the United States Senate for the period of six (6) years. Brother Atchison also served as a major general in the Missouri State Militia in 1838 during Missouri's Mormon War and a Confederate brigadier general during the American Civil War under the command of Major General Sterling Price in the Missouri Home Guard.



The circumstances of his Presidency was the transition from President James Polk to Zachary Taylor. According to the law at that time, President Polk had stepped down as President on Sunday, March 4, 1849. Zachary Taylor being a deeply religious man, refused to be inaugurated on a Sunday. Thus, according to ascension laws, the office falls to the Vice-President George M. Dallas however his term also ended on noon on March 4th. Thus, the Presidential line of succession then falls to the President Pro Tem of the Senate - who was Brother David Rice Atchison.

This problem was debated in the Congress for several hours and was then agreed on by them that Brother Atchison, although never inaugurated was legally and by the Constitution, as he was the President Pro Tem of the Senate assumed the duties as acting President of the United States from noon on March 4, 1849 until noon on March 5, 1849.

In the courthouse of Plattsburg, Missouri, there stands a statute of Brother Atchison bearing the inscription "David Rice Atchison 1807-1886, President of the United States for One Day."

Brother Atchison was a member of Platte Lodge No. 56 in Platte City, Missouri.
